Thanks to our wonderful board of volunteers, we have made great strides in spreading the word that Dyslexia is NOT seeing words backwards. Dyslexia is a brainbased, neurological condition that affects many areas of academic success, including reading, mathematics, handwriting, spelling, and memory. I'm delighted to report that during 2018 we held a free webinar every month and discussed various topics related to learning and dyslexia. Our webinars have been attended by people from

all over the United States, as well as Canada, Europe, Australia and more. We have two active parent support groups, one in the Riverside area and one in Orange County. These free groups provide an opportunity for parents of children with dyslexia and other language learning difficulties to get together and share ideas, solutions, frustrations, and successes.
